Myxothiazol was first isolated as an antifungal antibiotic which was also active against several Gram-positive bacteria. Myxothiazol was found to bind to the quinol oxidation (Qo) site of the bc1 complex, blocking electron transfer to the Rieske iron-sulfur protein in the mitochondrial respiratory chain. Oxygen consumption blockage leads to a cytostatic effect that could be reversed. Myxothiazol, as other epothilones, which are known for their antitumor activity, contains a thiazole ring that is formed by the incorporation of cysteine into the polyketide backbone.
